About GriefLink

GriefLink is a website providing information on many aspects of death-related grief, including local supports and resources for loss and grief in South Australia. GriefLink is principally aimed at:

- * bereaved individuals and families
- * friends and carers of the bereaved
- * bereavement support groups
- * health and welfare professionals
- * educational institutions

GriefLink provides:

- * information about different death-related grief topics, such as the death of a child and suicide
- * listings of resources such as books and videos
- * listings of bereavement services and supports in South Australia for self and professional referral
- * information about educational activities and courses in South Australia for bereaved persons and professionals
- * links with other information sources and organisations
- * links to other grief-related sites
- * a quiz for site users to test their knowledge about grief

How was GriefLink developed?

GriefLink was a joint project between the National Association for Loss and Grief (South Australia) Inc and the Discipline of General Practice at the University of Adelaide in South Australia. It was originally funded by a grant from the South Australian Department of Human Services to be a community resource for the State.

A major review and upgrade of the website was undertaken in 2009, supported by a Community benefits Grant from the Department of families and Communities.

The information on the site has been compiled, developed and reviewed by a broad range of professionals and consumers in South Australia with knowledge and experience in the area of loss and grief. International codes of conduct for web sites providing health information were also used as a basis for its development.

The content, format and design of the site have been evaluated by key stakeholders, members of the SA community and health and welfare professionals. Information on the site is constantly being updated through community input.
